2024 NSW Local Government elections

The 2024 NSW Local Government elections will be held on Saturday, 14 September 2024. Key dates for the elections can be found on the NSW Electoral Commission's website elections.nsw.gov.au Voting options include attendance in person on and before election day, postal voting and telephone assisted voting for electors who are blind or who have low vision.

Nominate as a Mayor or Councillor

You must lodge a nomination form either online or by obtaining nomination forms from our website elections.nsw.gov.au or the Returning Officer's office and lodging with the Returning Officer.

Candidates must also complete and lodge a candidate information sheet and statistical information sheet.

Lodge your nomination

The NSW Electoral Commission strongly encourages you to lodge your nomination online.

If using paper nomination forms, you must lodge your nomination and deposit with the Returning Officer for the council area in which you intend to stand as a candidate. Returning Officer office locations can be found on our website.

You are encouraged to start preparing your nomination now.

Nomination forms, grouping forms and nomination deposits must be lodged between Monday, 5 August and 12 noon, Wednesday 14 August 2024.

Late nominations cannot be accepted.

Registration for electoral funding purposes

Prior to being nominated, candidates and groups wishing to accept political donations or pay for electoral expenditure must first apply to the NSW Electoral Commission to be registered for electoral funding purposes. Only once registered is a candidate or group allowed to accept political donations and pay for electoral expenditure.

Candidates and groups can apply to be registered through the NSW Electoral Commission's online registration and disclosure system, Funding and Disclosure Online. Forms are also available by request at fdc@elections.nsw.gov.au or 1300 022 011.

Applications for registration for electoral funding purposes close on Wednesday, 14 August 2024.

Draft Amendment to Bathurst Regional Development Control Plan 2014 - Ashworth Drive Land Use Buffer

Council has prepared an amendment to Bathurst Regional Development Control Plan 2014 (DCP 2014) in relation to land known as Lot I DP 1130765, 2 Ashworth Drive Kelso. The amendment seeks to remove an existing 25-metre-wide "Land Use Buffer" identified on the northern side of the land and introduce the following controls:

- A minimum 10-metre-wide building setback from the northern and western boundaries adjoining existing residential properties.
- A minimum 3-metre-wide "Landscaping Buffer" alongside the northern and western boundaries adjoining existing residential properties, including controls relating to the design, location, spacing and treatment of the landscaping.
- A maximum building height limit of 691.5m AHD to ensure that any future development would not exceed the ridge line of the existing "Total Tools" building.
- Controls relating to the design, external colour scheme, materials and signage of any new commercial buildings erected on the land.
- Controls relating to the design and location of loading/unloading facilities and manoeuvring areas associated with service vehicles, to minimise noise impacts on the surrounding residential area.
- Requirement for the preparation of a noise impact assessment for any future Development Application involving "higher impact" land use(s) and/or operations occurring outside of ordinary business hours.

- I. Ensure the plans reflect current legislation.
- 2. Ensure that the Development Contribution rates remain closely representative of infrastructure costs.

Bathurst Regional Council in partnership with the Bathurst Regional Access Committee provides grants to assist businesses and non-profit organisations improve access and inclusion to their place of business/ organisation.

Dhuluny 11-17 August 2024

Dhuluny (pronounced Duh-Loin) is a Wiradyuri word for 'truth', 'rightness', or 'gospel', and means rectitude, that which is direct, straight, acting, living.

Dhuluny is a series of events commemorating the 200-year anniversary of the declaration of Martial Law against the Wiradyuri people in the Bathurst region. Between 11 & 17 August 2024, these events offer the opportunity to share and understand the true history of our Country and celebrate the resilience of the Wiradyuri Nation.

The Dhuluny program encompasses a range of activities including crafting workshops, a film festival, ceremonies, conference, markets, and more! While most of these activities are complimentary, RSVPs are essential to secure a spot due to high demand.

As part of the Dhuluny Program 2024, Bathurst Regional Art Gallery are hosting a major exhibition, **Dhuluny: the war that never ended**, curated by Wiradyuri/Kamilaroi curator Jonathan Jones with Wirribee Aunty Leanna Carr, **6 July – 8 September 2024.**

Dhuluny: the war that never ended features works by established and emerging Wiradyuri artists including Wirribee Aunty Leanna Carr; Michael Riley; HJ Wedge; Kevin Gilbert; Lorraine Connelly-Northey; Lucy Williams-Connelly; Karla Dickens; Jazz Money; Jamie-Lea Trindall; and Bria McCarthy. The exhibition responds to Martial Law, truthtelling about the Frontier Wars, and the ongoing national significance of the local events of Bathurst.
