Council's Strategic Planning Section is preparing the next update to the Bathurst Region Heritage Plan. The Plan aims to guide heritage management within the Bathurst Regional Local Government Area (LGA) and establishes the key strategic priorities and associated actions for heritage management over a period of 4 years.

Heritage management includes the protection and promotion of heritage across Council's departments. Importantly, for Council to operate its Heritage Advisory services and for that service to be supported by a grant provided by Heritage NSW, Council must have an adopted Heritage Plan in place.

The current plan covers the 2021-2025 period and is due to be updated in 2025.

Council is seeking to survey a wide range of community members aiming to:

- · Gauge the community's understanding of Council's heritage management practices,
- Gauge the community's current values as they relate to heritage matters,
- Understand the community's opinion on heritage related challenges, and
- Discover how achievements of the Heritage Plan can be better shared with interested parties.

Bathurst Library has launched its new 'Mind Alive Dementia Friendly Collection', a new loanable collection aimed at enhancing access, reminiscence and engagement for individuals living with dementia and their caregivers.

This new collection includes a curated selection of photo boards, puzzles, games, DVDs, and books designed to offer mental stimulation, enjoyment, and relaxation.

Victims can use 'Empower You' to obtain contact details of support services in the area they live, to send messages with your location to trusted friends, or to gather information about your experiences in an admissible form.



'Empower You' allows victims to document abuse, which is often difficult to recall when in distress or when it occurs over long periods of time, including photos of injuries and property damage, and screenshots of emails or messages – and document an incident when it happens, no matter how minor or whether they report it to police at that time.

Pet-oween comes to BARC

The Bathurst Animal Rehoming Centre (BARC) is located at 58 Hampden Park Road Kelso. The state of the art facility provides care for lost, stray and surrendered animals until they can be adopted to new forever homes.

Throughout the year, the BARC team have been active at community events to help promote the facility and to find new homes for animals in their care. Earlier this year a total of 17 cats and kittens were rehomed after being cared for by Bathurst High School students as part of the Royal Bathurst Show Animal Nursery.

In July, the team successfully rehomed 13 dogs and 15 cats after attending the Bathurst Winter Festival with a display featuring animals available for adoption.

The team will hold two more events this year to promote pet adoptions. There's 'Pet-oween' on 26 and 27 October 2024 and 'Pet-xmas' on 14 and 15 December 2024.

Following community feedback, these two events will see BARC open on the weekend, catering for those people keen to adopt who can't make a midweek appointment. Coming up for BARC:

Pet-oween Adoption weekend 26 and 27 October. Open from I0am to Ipm Saturday and Sunday.

Pet-xmas Adoption weekend 14 and 15 December. Open from 10am to 1pm Saturday and Sunday.

Looking back, Deb finds the most fulfilling experiences come from seeing children thrive through her child-centred approach. "Building strong partnerships with children allows me to support them in whatever they need," she said. The relationships she's formed



over the years, and seeing former children remember their time with her, are particularly meaningful to her.

When asked to share a story that highlights the unique bond she's developed with the children and families she's worked with, Deb finds it impossible to choose just one. "There are too many! Watching them go off to school - it's all about seeing the independence and autonomy that springs from the play-based learning I provide."

Sawpit Creek

Stage I of the Sawpit Creek Open Space Reserve is now complete running from the Michell Highway to just north of Munro St adjacent to the suburbs of Llanarth and Windradyne with future stages reaching down to Ophir Road.

Extensive vegetation works have occurred including the planting of more than 30,000 tubestock grasses, acacia and wattles and more than 3,500 eucalypts including Apple Box and Ribbon Gum.

Council received a \$1.27million grant from the Regional Housing Program for these works.





Sightscreens installed

The finishing touches - new cricket sightscreens - have been installed and complete the redevelopment of Bathurst Sportsground.

The screens can flip from black to white for day or night games and can be moved along rails so they can cover the wicket, depending on where it is located.



Wonderful Wonderful

Bathurst Regional Art Gallery (BRAG) dives deep into the permanent collection to present new exhibition, Wonderful Wonderful: Scenes from the Collection.

Changing Places update

Work is progressing well on the construction of the changing places facility at Bicentennial Park.

The new changing places facility will include an accessible toilet/parents room, an accessible 'Changing Places' Design 2.0 adult change facility that includes a toilet, shower, adult changing table and overhead crane to meet special accessibility needs. An accessible footpath will connect the facility to two new accessible parking spaces on William Street and an accessible footpath with a pram ramp is built from Charlotte Street.

There will also be male and female toilets included in the block.

Works are expected to be completed in December.
