Temporary Road Closure 2024 Mount Panorama Punish

Council advises that the Mount Panorama Racetrack will be temporarily closed to traffic on **Sunday 27 October 2024 to non-residents, between 7.45am and 9.30am**. The temporary closure is for the Panorama Punish.

2024 Bathurst Wallabies Triathlon

Council advises the 2024 Bathurst Wallabies Triathlon includes the following temporary road closures on Sunday 27 October 2024, between 8am and 11am:

- William Street between Charlotte Street and Stanley Street
- Stanley Street between William Street and George Street

2024 Rally of Bathurst

Council advises that Russell Street between William Street and George Street will be temporarily closed on Saturday 2 November 2024 between 6.30am and 12 noon.

The temporary closure is for the start of the 2024 Rally of Bathurst.

Mitre and Howick Street Roundabout Works

Bathurst Regional Council recently received Federal Government 'Black Spot' grant funding to improve the safety of the Mitre & Howick Streets roundabout.

The funding of \$445,000 will address the following proposed reconstruction works:

- Removal and replacement of the existing centre island apron with a larger apron. The central landscaped part of the centre island will remain unchanged.
- Removal and reconstruction of all existing splitter islands to remove slip lanes and increase pedestrian refuge space at crossings.
- The centre island apron and splitter island reconstruction works include level adjustments to improve drainage and road pavement crossfall.
- Milling of existing road surface and placement of new asphalt to match the new larger centre island and road pavement alignment/levels and provide a smooth and high grip driving surface.
- New line marking and signage relocation to suit the new roundabout geometry.

Works will **commence on Tuesday 15 October 2024**, requiring full closure of the roundabout for the first 3-weeks of the initial reconstruction work. Residential driveways adjacent to the work site will remain accessible.

In total, the works are expected to take 6 -10 weeks with completion anticipated by Friday 20 December 2024. Following the initial 3-week full road closure, the road will be reopened to traffic in accordance with traffic control conditions while the remainder of the works are completed.

Bathurst Traffic Model Update

The Bathurst Traffic Model was developed for the Bathurst region in 2019 to guide the road network planning process. The transport model is a powerful tool for informing the planning and decision-making process, understanding the potential future pinch points and comparing the impact of different infrastructure and land release scenarios.

The Bathurst Traffic Model is being updated with additional counts to be undertaken on 30 and/or 31 October. Traffic counters will be set up from the beginning of the week commencing 28 October.

The update to the Bathurst Traffic Model will enable the predicted growth of an additional 12,690 persons by 2041 to be modelled (NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure population projections).

Council's contribution to the update of the Bathurst Traffic Model is funded through a grant from NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infastructure.

Whats on: BRAG Artifact of the Anthropocene

Artefact of the Anthropocene plays with the idea that one day disposable plastic bread tags would become "extinct" as more sustainable solutions are found to replace them. This idea that they would become relics, artefacts and collectables sparked my interest to collect them and compile records about them. Their invasive nature, where they are found globally, their different shapes, attributes and characteristics.

This collection represents bread tags from a period of around 8 years, saved and sent to me by people from across the globe. There are specimens from 21 countries of varying ages and histories, dating back to the 1970's through to recent cardboard specimens displayed as Wunderkammers or cabinets of curiosities. As an inherent bowerbird, I connected to this Sixteenth Century trend of gathering new, absurd and interesting objects and presenting them for personal pleasure but also for others to admire, telling stories about the world and its history. There is a satisfaction that comes with compiling a collection and organising it, with individual pieces becoming part of a larger collective that then forms a new narrative and context in a personal and historical sphere.

Artefact of the Anthropocene explores the intersection between modern archaeology, activism, environmental awareness, culture, art and creation in one thematic collection of the humble bread tag. Aiming to connect with audiences through nostalgia whilst highlighting the absurdity of designing demand for and then manufacturing single use items that last forever.
