1 LOAN FUNDING FROM NSW TREASURY CORPORATION (16.00020)

Recommendation: That Council approve the execution of the Loan Agreement with New South Wales Treasury Corporation.

Report: Bathurst Regional Council's Annual Operating Plan 2016/2017 includes loan funding for various projects.

Council is now able to take advantage of borrowing at a reduced interest rate through NSW Treasury Corporation (TCorp). The rates offered by TCorp, shown at <u>attachment 1</u>)are 3.10% for a ten year loan and 3.75% for a twenty year loan, the higher rate due to the interest rate risk uncertainty over the longer term. As a comparison, last year's borrowings from ANZ were completed at an interest rate of 3.47% fixed for ten years and Council also has a ten year floating rate loan with NAB which was reset on 17 May 2017 at 3.69%.

Part of the requirements of the borrowing process is that the execution of the loan agreement, shown at <u>attachment 2</u> must be approved at a Council meeting.

<u>Financial Implications</u>: Loan funding, and subsequent repayment, has been included in the Annual Operating Plan 2016/2017 to undertake various capital projects.
