Odours Factsheet

Council's sewage network and treatment system plays a crucial role in managing the impact of Bathurst's waste water on our environment and community. Treating waste water can result in odours, and Council endeavours to minimise these as far as reasonably practicable.



Sewage treatment and odours

On any given day, we implement multiple processes to improve sewage treatment and minimise odours. Odour can occur during planned and unplanned maintenance. Odours can also be exasperated by certain weather conditions and daily weather fluctuations.

What are we doing?



Odour management

Council has undertaken upgrades and carries out regular maintenance to minimise odours.



Best practice and compliance

We align best practice and ensure we comply with all regulatory requirements as far as reasonably practicable.



Odour monitoring

We monitor odours and environmental conditions to improve management and communication with our neighbours.

What can you do?



Observe weather conditions

Close windows and doors when winds carry odours from the wastewater treatment plant. Be aware that certain weather can exacerbate odours.

Plant a wind buffer

Consider planting a wind buffer to reduce wind flows from the wastewater treatment plant.
